Robin Mirsky is Executive Director of the Rogers Group of Funds:- The Rogers Telefund has approximately \$35 million available for bridge financing for Canadian programs. The Rogers Documentary Fund, for Canadian documentaries has given grants to more than 300 documentary films.

The Rogers Cable Network Fund an equity investment fund for Canadian cable channels will infuse an estimated \$7 million annually into Canadian independent production.
